Dear Warner School Student,

The University of Rochester has launched an online **COVID-19 Safety Training Module** that all students, faculty and staff need to complete in preparation for safely returning to campus in the coming weeks and months. The module is designed to ensure that everyone understands the operational and procedural changes the University has made in response to COVID-19, as well as explain the personal precautions that University community members are expected to take in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, including adhering to face covering and social distancing guidelines.

You are receiving this email now as a notification that you should access and complete the mandatory training by August 1, even if you are only taking online classes and don't anticipate coming to campus. We want to make certain that all members of our community are prepared to come to campus safely whatever their reason.

- Students can access the training through [Blackboard](#). It will be listed as "Return to Campus COVID-19 Safety Training."
- If you are both a current student and employee, you should use the MyPath version.

The full training module takes about 15-20 minutes to complete and can be taken on a computer, phone or tablet. Once you have reviewed all of the information, check the "completed" box at the end to verify your participation.

The University is also implementing Dr. ChatBot, an online tool developed by the Medical Center to screen students, faculty, and staff for symptoms before coming to campus. The online screening process takes less than two minutes and can be completed on a computer, tablet, or smartphone with internet access. A forthcoming email will provide instructions for starting to use Dr. ChatBot. But, before using Dr. Chatbot, you need to have first completed the COVID-19 Safety module, as described above.
